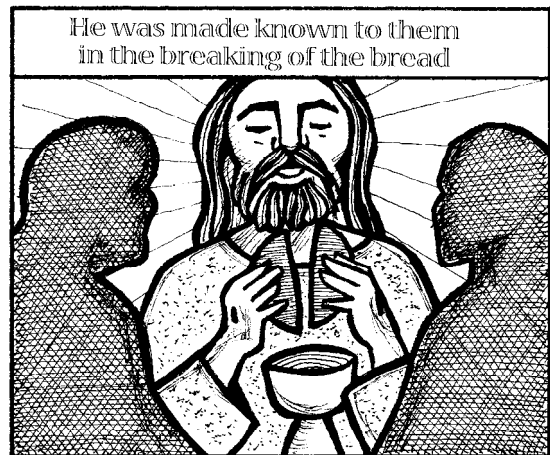

Dear Friends,

There is something very enjoyable about the little drama described in today's Gospel. Two disciples, walking to a village seven miles from Jerusalem, meet Jesus but don't recognize him. Ironically, they are talking about him and all the things that have happened - his arrest and trial, his death, his now missing body. The events are so vivid to them that they can't believe everyone hasn't heard about them. We might expect that they would recognize that their traveling companion was Jesus when he started interpreting the Scriptures to them. Certainly his teaching set their heart on fire. Certainly it led them to ask him to stay with them. It is the same for us. We can learn all about Jesus and study the Scriptures, but he will only really be known to us in the breaking of the bread, in the Eucharist.

More than one hundred second graders of our parish will receive Eucharist for the first time over the next two weekends. Their First Communion is a very big day for them and I hope you will enjoy being a part of it. All of the Masses, except for the Sunday 7:00 a.m. and 5:30 p.m., will have children celebrating their First Communion. May they and their families continue to be close to the Lord all the days of their lives. ~ Fr. McNamara
