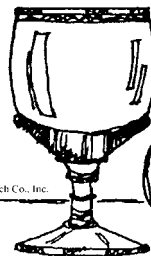


IMPORTANT DATES

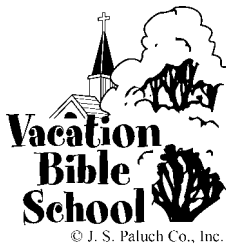

Possible Indicators of Child Abuse and Neglect

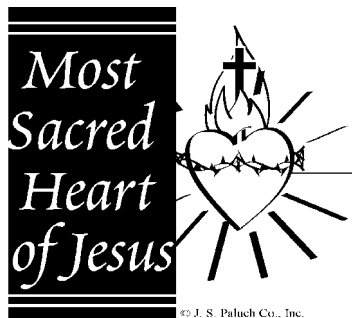
A Key to reporting child abuse and neglect is being able to recognize common indicators. In a parent, the following signs may signal the presence of child abuse or neglect: Shows little concern for the child. Blames the child for the child's problems in school or at home. Asks teachers or other caretakers to use harsh physical discipline if the child misbehaves. Sees the child as entirely bad, worthless or burdensome. 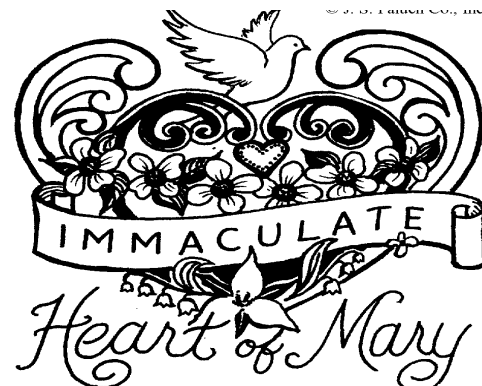
