**Dr. Cecilia González-Andrieu** received her doctorate from the Graduate Theological Union in the areas of Art & Religion and Systematic Theology. Gonzalez-Andrieu is a graduate of Loyola Marymount University where she studied Film, Spanish and Theology. Specializing in Theological Aesthetics, U.S. Latino Theology, and Systematic Theology, González-Andrieu is currently completing her first book on *Bridge to Wonder: the Arts as a Gospel of Beauty* (Baylor University Press, 2012). She was recently featured as one of the seven most promising theologians of the next generation in *America* magazine online. Among other recognitions she was awarded Best National Column Award from the Catholic Press Association for her regular column of essays, "De Todo Un Poco" in *The Tidings*. Dr. González-Andrieu is co-director of the Latino Theology and Ministry Initiative at LMU and organizer of the 2014 National Symposium on the Present and Future of Catholic Hispanic Ministry in the United States, to be held at Loyola Marymount University in partnership with Boston College, Barry University and the University of Notre Dame.
